

Show Management Policies  
Cave Creek Cutting Horse Association  
Adopted by Board August 20, 2007

The following policies have been adopted by the Cave Creek Cutting Horse Association Board of Directors to supplement, clarify and interpret the Rulebook.

1. The use of fresh or rerun cattle shall be determined by the Board prior to the beginning of each season. The current policy for non NCHA shows will be:
  - a. Fresh cattle will generally be used for the following classes, Open, Non Pro, and \$2000 Limit Rider.
  - b. Approximately 3 fresh cattle/cutter in a class will be used in the fresh cattle classes.
  - c. Rerun cattle will be used for all other classes.
  - d. Approximately 3.5 rerun cattle/cutter in a class will be used in the rerun cattle classes.
  - e. Approximately 180 fresh cattle will be provided per show. The number of cutters entered for the show may affect which classes use fresh or rerun cattle.
  - f. The Show Director may modify these policies for any particular show, depending on the size of show, size of classes, combining of classes and availability of cattle.
2. When two classes which run in consecutive order each have less than 10 cutters showing or less than 20 total in both classes, the classes may be combined into one herd at the discretion of the Show Director. If a "fresh cattle" class is combined with a "rerun cattle" class, the "fresh cattle" class must go first. Otherwise, the order of the classes shall be the same as is normally scheduled.
3. The Show Director will decide when a class will be split into two herds.
4. The following policies will apply regarding scratching of entries:
  - a. If a paid entrant who reserved cattle scratches on the day of the show prior to the drawing of a class, the cutter will be given a full refund if the reserved cattle are used by another cutter. If the cattle are not used, the cost of the cattle may be deducted from the refund at the discretion of the CCCHA Board. This determination may not be made by the CCCHA Board until after the show has ended.
  - b. If a paid entrant scratches after the draw, no refund will be made.
  - c. If an unpaid entrant has reserved cattle for a show and is a "no show" or scratches prior to the draw, the cutter may be billed for the reserved cattle at the discretion of CCCHA Board. This determination may not be made by the CCCHA until after the show has ended.

5. To be eligible for circuit awards for a multiple day show, cutters must participate in the same classes in all shows for which the circuit awards apply. The circuit award winners will be based upon the total score earned for all days of the circuit in each class.
6. Cutters may show in any class for “no score”, but must notify the Show Secretary prior to the draw that they are not to be scored. The cutter must pay the entire entry fee, will not be judged, will show at the end of the class and will be excluded from the results of the class.
7. Classes will be closed and the draw will take place approximately one class prior to the class go. Such factors as size of show, size of classes and time of day may affect when a class is closed and drawn. The Secretary shall have the Show Announcer notify the cutters prior to closing of a class.
